Tax credit donations help reduce entrance and transportation fees for field trips so we don't have to charge our students so much. Tax credit donations help fund **extracurricular programs** that expand learning and opportunities for our students. State law allows married taxpayers to receive up to \$400 tax credit and single taxpayers up to \$200 on Arizona State income taxes. This tax credit is available to all qualifying individual Arizona State taxpayers. You do not need to have a child enrolled in a school to take advantage of this credit. Gifted Services Testing Opportunity

Washington Elementary School District provides a continuum of services for students identified as gifted. Testing for placement in the gifted program takes place three times a year on ALL campuses.
